Biographical Brief: Kenneth H. Senser

Ken Senser joined Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., in September 2003 as the Vice President for Global Security. In August 2004, his responsibilities expanded to include Aviation and Travel leading to his promotion in December 2005 to Senior Vice President.

Before joining Wal-Mart, Ken served as the Assistant Director of the FBI for Security. In this role, he established the first division at the FBI focused on security. His initiation of the transformation of the FBI security program followed the espionage arrest of Special Agent Robert Hanssen.

Ken also had responsibility for continuity of operations. Prior to his assignment to the FBI in 1999, Ken served for 16 years at the Central Intelligence Agency, holding various senior management positions. Over the course of his career, he served in assignments encompassing the physical, technical, protective, and personnel security disciplines. While with the CIA, Ken received one of its most prestigious awards, the Distinguished Career Intelligence Medal, as well as the Career Intelligence Medal, Intelligence Commendation Medal, and many other awards and commendations.

Before joining the government, Ken spent two years conducting criminal fraud investigations in Ohio. He was born in Cleveland, Ohio, and received a BS in Criminal Justice from the University of Cincinnati. He is a member of the American Society for Industrial Security, International Association of Chiefs of Police, and the International Security Management Association.
